

Presentation Formats

There are four available formats for presentation: lectures, workshops, proffered papers and poster presentations.

Lecture: A 30 or 50-minute session with a single theme. A lecture is defined as a formal, didactic talk intended to provide information or teach people about a particular subject and/or research experience. Lectures may be presented by an individual or a panel of experts (maximum 4 speakers.)

Workshop: An 80 minute session that may be presented by an individual or multiple speakers - maximum of 4 speakers. Workshops are interactive, intended for audience participation and discussion and should include the following characteristics:

- Provide participants with a practical application of a practice, theory or policy
- Offer relevant and timely topic and content;
- Provide opportunity for speaker interaction with participants.

Proffered Paper: A 20 minute session (including 3 minutes of Q&A).

Non-Scientific Paper: The presenter must clearly address a relevant topic and the learning objectives must be clearly outlined in the program proposal.

Scientific Papers: The presenter must state the hypotheses tested, provide a description of the methods used, state the results and the conclusions obtained.

Poster Presentation: Both scientific and non-scientific submissions will be considered for the poster competition. It is expected that one of the authors be present at a predetermined time during breaks and/or lunches to answer any questions.
